










# July Vocabulary

<p><b>downpour</b> n.</p> 	<p>heavy rain</p>	<p><b>to overflow</b> v. (overflowed)</p> 	<p>when there is too much water in a container and it goes everywhere</p>
<p><b>paua</b> n.</p> 	<p>a beautiful rainbow coloured shell (used for jewellery)</p>	<p><b>puddle</b> n.</p> 	<p>a small dirty pool of rainwater</p>
<p><b>windscreen wiper</b> n.</p> 	<p>a rubber blade on a car window which wipes water away when it's raining</p>	<p><b>waterproof</b> a.</p> 	<p>keeps water out</p>
<p><b>flood</b> n.</p> 	<p>when it rains too much the land becomes covered with water</p>	<p><b>to be blown inside out</b> v.</p> 	<p>in windy weather your umbrella gets blown the opposite way</p>
<p><b>slippery</b> a.</p> 	<p>dangerous to drive or walk on e.g. a wet or icy road</p>	<p><b>toast</b> n.</p> 	<p>a slice of bread cooked in a toaster</p>
<p><b>to skid</b> v. (skidded)</p> 	<p>to lose control when driving on a wet road</p>	<p><b>marmalade</b> n.</p> 	<p>jam made out of lemon or grapefruit</p>
<p><b>numb</b> a. number, numbest</p> 	<p>to have no feeling in part of your body</p>	<p><b>runny nose</b> a.</p> 	<p>your nose gets wet and runny when you have a cold</p>
<p><b>to get steamed up</b> v. (got steamed up)</p> 	<p>to become covered with condensation e.g. kitchen window when you're cooking</p>	<p><b>cramp</b> n.</p> 	<p>a sudden pain in your muscle from cold</p>
<p><b>stuffy</b> a.</p> 	<p>no fresh air (in a room)</p>	<p><b>draught</b> n.</p> 	<p>cold air that comes into a room through an open door or window</p>
<p><b>spouting</b> n.</p> 	<p>plastic channels along the edge of your roof to collect rain water</p>	<p><b>ski report</b> n.</p> 	<p>a weather forecast about skiing conditions in the mountains</p>
